- The stomach bug has hit some of our classes. We knew it would come eventually.


Something We Need Help With:

Nurse's Corner

Welcome Back Rumney Families,

We are off to a great start! Someday, we'll be able to send out a "welcome back" letter and not mention Covid, but we're not there yet. Superintendent Meagan Roy, sent out updated Covid-19 [guidance](#) last week outlining many of the answers to how our school district will approach illness and covid in our schools this year. Although we have adapted to life with Covid, the virus remains a disruptive force. Our goal is to keep things moving forward as smoothly as possible. If your child has any symptoms of illness, please keep them home and check in with the school nurse, Bonne Cadwell. Testing is available as needed. Masks are optional. Doctors and the CDC still advise that wearing a mask situationally is a good way to slow down spread of the virus.

If your child will have medication to be administered at school, then fill out this [form](#) and return it to school with the medication. I can administer medication when I have a form with both parent and provider signature on it. Each year, a new and updated Asthma Action Plan will need to be obtained for each student requiring an asthma inhaler.

We are excited to announce the launch of a new program for youth in Central Vermont.

Afterschool in Nature at Sage Mountain Botanical Sanctuary is a program serving youth in grades 4 through 8, meeting Monday through Friday, hosted on our 600-acre nature reserve in Orange Vermont.

Our Afterschool in Nature curriculum intimately follows the cycle of the seasons, wildlife, and local flora. Youth will explore this ancient rhythm by splashing in mountain streams, helping to grow delicious and healthy foods in the garden meadow, and experiencing quality time outdoors through a variety of different activities. In the process, they will learn not only about the natural communities that surround them, but also about themselves, their peers, and the world at large.

Afterschool in Nature offers a sliding scale tuition and scholarships to make this program accessible for all families. We facilitate transportation from local schools in Orange and Washington Counties for those in need. Our program follows state health and safety guidance.

Program begins September 1st, 2022.
