Good afternoon U-32 students,

I hope this email finds you doing great AND looking forward to a long Memorial Day Weekend. I want to share information with you about what the end of the school year will look like - including returning books and uniforms

1. There is no school on Monday. Please check with ALL of your teachers to make sure that you know if you have Class 1 and 2 assignments or class meetings rescheduled to Wednesday.
2. The last day of school will be Thursday, June 11th. Classes that normally meet on Fridays (Class 7 and 8) will meet on Wednesday instead. Check with your teachers about times.
3. We are asking you to find a time to come to U-32 and empty your locker and return all school supplies that you have. If you borrowed a book from a teacher, the library, or your teacher's classroom collection, please return those as well. If you played a fall or winter sport and haven't returned your uniform or equipment, please do so also. You may keep your Chromebook if you want BUT if there is anything that needs to be fixed on it (screen cracked, keyboard missing, etc.), please return it so that it is ready for the Fall. Please do not wait until August to get it fixed because the IT department won't have as much time.

We would prefer that you come to U-32 during one of the times listed here BUT if you would like to email me, we can arrange for a different time that works for you and your family. Remember that when you come, you will need to wear a mask and leave 6' between you and anyone else. All uniforms should be in one plastic bag and books should be in another one. Please don't bring anything to return that is not in a plastic or paper bag.
